THEIR STORY

Carlos was born in the state of Mexico, and has 4 siblings. He was raised with his parents who worked in the fields. He arrived in Ensenada when he was 29 years of age. He was able to have an education up to middle school. When he was 24 years old he met his partner with whom he has two children. He works in the field with a salary of 1800 a week.

Idialia was born in Oaxaca, raised with 8 siblings. Her parents worked in the field. She was only able to have an education up to middle school given that she had to work to help with home expenses. When she was 17 years of age she left home in search of a job in Ensenada because that she had an uncle living here who encouraged her to come. Her parents now live here also. She is married to Carlos and has 2 children. She is a housewife.

They met 8 years ago because they had friends in common. They both worked in the beginning, but after a while they had children and now Carlos is the only one who works. They are living in a house that belongs to Carlo's parents. His salary is not enough to build a house of their own. They had a car accident 2 years ago in which Idalia suffered a lot of injuries but she survived.

SPIRITUAL LIFE

They are Catholic but are open to word of God. In fact the pastor mentions that they always attend the church activities. Also they have been neighbors for many years.

Their Community

The Garcia Ruiz family is currently living in a small rural community called Uruapan, south of Ensenada. This area of the city is home to thousands of migrant families, who came from southern states of Mexico, looking for better opportunities. Many 'colonias' don't have the most basic services, such as running water, electricity, and sewage systems. However, these areas are often the ones that offer the lowest prices to acquire a piece of land, and for that reason many families will buy in those areas despite the lack of services. For these families, the most common job opportunity is as a field laborer, providing workers the equivalent of about 65 dollars per week. These factors combined create a challenging environment for families to grow and create a safe space to call home.
